- Schooling permitted from 7:45am – 8:45am for \$5/schooling ticket
- 15 minute break between divisions for resetting fences/course walks
- Optimum time: Round closest to optimum time without faults wins. Rail=4 faults, Over-time=1 fault/second, Refusal= 4 faults.
- Power and speed: Normal course for power portion. Considered ‘clear’ if no faults (time, rails, refusals). If power portion is clear, rider continues directly to speed portion. Fastest time for speed portion wins.
- Gambler’s Choice: Each fence will be given a point value. Rider has 75 seconds to earn as many points as possible. Each jump may only be jumped twice. Refusal or knocked rail results in 0 points earned for that fence, and fence cannot be jumped again. Gambler gets choice of attempting final fence at end of round. Refusal or knocked rail at the gambler’s choice final fence results in negative points. Highest points wins.
