Where: **Bridle Trails State Park.** Take Exit 17 off I-405 (NE 70th Place), turn south onto 116th Avenue (just east of 405) past NE 60th St to the park entrance at about NE 53rd St. We will gather in the parking lot just south of the entrance.

Preparation: Wear hiking boots and clothing for wet and cool weather.
