## ***NATURE WALK IN BRIDLE TRAILS STATE PARK***

**Where:** **Bridle Trails State Park.** Take Exit 17 off I-405 (NE 70<sup>th</sup> Place), turn south onto 116<sup>th</sup> Avenue (just east of 405) past NE 60<sup>th</sup> St to the park entrance at about NE 53<sup>rd</sup> St. We will gather in the parking lot just south of the entrance.

**Preparation:** Wear hiking boots and clothing for wet and cool weather.
